Background:	<p>The Fiji Forum Livestock meeting with the theme “Livestock for Livelihoods – new generation thinking” is part of the Pacific Agriculture Policy Project (PAPP), a major initiative funded by the European Union and implemented by the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC). Financial and logistical support was also provided by the Animal Health and Production section of the LRD Trade and Agribusiness programme, and the Fiji Crop and Livestock Council.</p> <p>PAPP aims to strengthen smallholder farmer livelihoods by promoting (i) stronger linkages to markets (ii) dissemination of information, research and leanings for sustainable crop production and (iii) evidence based policies that provide a coherent approach for production, research and development and growing an agricultural and forestry that is aligned to broader national development goals. In the framework of the programme, the three main results are expected to be achieved by SPC:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Strengthen regional agricultural development strategy 2. Improve the dissemination and adoption of applied agricultural production research technologies 3. Contribute to agricultural enterprise development through improved market linkages <p>The consultation was facilitated by SPC’s Land Resources Division in conjunction with partners Fiji Ministry of Agriculture and Fiji Crop and Livestock Council the Fiji Livestock Sector Forum was held to raise awareness and share information on the changing landscape of livestock development in Fiji. The forum also provided an opportunity to further consult widely on the proposed Fiji Livestock Feed Bill and to raise awareness on the National Agriculture Policy 2020.</p> <p>PAPP team members were given the opportunity to present a brief overview of the projects Key Result areas with the main notion of linking it to Agriculture and Forestry.</p> <p>The meeting participants included young livestock farmers, business operators, processors and sector associations. They represented those working with beef and dairy cattle, goats, sheep, pigs, poultry, honeybees and animal feed.</p> <p>Expected outputs of the national consultation were to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A strategy on the way forward for the development of Fiji’s livestock sector. • Stakeholder Feedback on the proposed Fiji Livestock Feed Bill. • Greater awareness of the Fiji National Agriculture Policy 2020 • Attract young farmers to livestock farming <p>The sessions also included discussions on the best way forward, exploiting opportunities and strengths, within the livestock sector.</p>
Activities:	<p>11th May, 2015 – Monday</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Travelled to Nadi • Sorted logistics and administrations issues. <p>Day one – 12th May, 2015 – Tuesday</p> <p>The meeting was officially opened by the chief guest the Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Finance, Mr. Filimone Waqabaca.</p>

	<p>Welcoming remarks were also, made by Mr. Xavier Canton Lamousse, for the Delegation of the European Union and Dr Ken Cokanasiga from the Secretariat of the Pacific Community.</p> <p>After the opening remarks all participants introduced themselves followed by the endorsement and adoption of agenda. The Director of Animal Health & Production, Fiji Ministry of Agriculture, Mr. Tomasi Tunabuna, then presented an overview of the livestock industry in Fiji. There were various presentations made by small-medium holder sector farmers on; Beef/sheep, sheep/goats, pigs, honey bees, dairy and poultry farming etc.,</p> <p>Following these, following Reps from Industries and Associations made presentations: Fiji Meat Industry Board, Fiji Cooperatives Dairy Company Ltd, Fiji Dairy Ltd, Yaqara Pastoral Company, Pig Producers Association, Poultry Producers Association, Bee Keepers Association, Feed millers and the Fiji Crops and Livestock Council..</p>
	<p>Day two – 13th May, 2015 – Wednesday</p> <p>The meeting started off with a brief recap of day 1 presentations highlighting some of the main issues raised by the presenters and participants.</p> <p>Then there were various presentations from the CE (EP&S) of the MoA, on the Fiji National Agriculture Policy 2020, followed by the Reserve Bank of Fiji, Fiji Development Bank and the i Taukei Land Trust Board (TLTB). A panel discussion involving the presenters then followed. Presentations from young livestock farmers followed by another panel discussion ended the morning sessions.</p> <p>The PAPP team gave an overview of the Pacific Agriculture Policy Project (PAPP), including the projects KRAs (Policy, Market and IKM), introduction of PAFNet, and a summary of the PAFNET livestock query. An overview of the work the PAPP is doing in trying to link agriculture to the tourism sector followed.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 	<p>Day three – 14th May, 2015 - Thursday</p> <p>Recap of Day 2 - The meeting broke into six groups for Session 1 and 2 to discuss constraints, prioritize the main ones, and propose strategies to address them. Each group presented on their discussions with early themes emerging for a strategy document.</p> <p>Group discussions continued to identify strengths and weaknesses, and to discuss ways to take advantage of opportunities. The groups presented their main points and further refined the strategy document - this will be used to help develop a national strategy for the development of the livestock sector.</p>
	<p>Day four – 15th May, 2015 – Friday</p> <p>The morning focused on discussions & recommendations on the way forward and formation of a Livestock Sector Strategy Working Group. The Working group was then given the task of finalising the Livestock strategy, identifying priorities and early winners that can be submitted for funding through the MoA 2016 national budget. .</p> <p>The final activity of the meeting was a Field Trip to a mushroom farm at a Legalega Research Station, and the private sector Toa poultry enterprise.</p>
